If you are interested in registering your child (no younger than 3 and must be potty-trained) in Play School, a tentative <u>Registration Meeting</u> has been scheduled.






So let's start applying the life-giving truth we find in the Bible so that we move from victimhood to victory.

Products offered (based on seasonal availability) at our farm stand will include:



One of the things I love most about my life is being busy. One of the things I fear most is wasting even a moment of my life doing nothing. If your inclinations are like mine (Yes, I'm a work-aholic and proud of it...!), then here's a little story we both should hear:

There was once a man who had a very important project he needed to finish. As the deadline approached, he decided he could work faster by bringing his project to his office at home. No sooner had he begun, however, when his young son appeared at his side, and asked his dad to stop working and spend time with him. Unwilling to heed his son's pleadings, he devised a plan that he hoped would distract the boy for at least awhile. Opening the Picture Atlas on his desk, he retrieved a map of the world, removed it, and tore it into smaller and smaller pieces. He stacked the pieces randomly in a pile, and handed the entire lot to his son. "Son," he said, "I'll happily spend time with you. But first, I want you to take all these pieces and put them back together in their proper order. Once you're done, we'll do whatever you wish!" To dad's surprise, barely five minutes had passed before the boy suddenly reappeared with the map of the world properly reassembled and everything in its place. "How did you manage this task so quickly?" he asked. "Oh, it wasn't difficult at all," the boy replied. "On the back of the page you had torn out, there was a picture of a man. When I put the picture of the man back together, the picture of the world came together exactly as it should!"




