You can register your child for Kindergarten in 2 ways:





Foundational Learners Assistance Eligibility

Alberta Community and Social Services is committed to ensuring that supports are available to assist learners in completing their high school education. Therefore, Prospect Human Services is contracted to provide Assessment and Case Management services for 16 – 20 year old learners seeking financial supports to attend public high school.

The Prospect Human Service's website is www.ProspectNow.ca which can help with a bit of information on Prospect Human Services including our mission, supporters, programs, and much more! The Youth Assessment Centre (YAC), a division of Prospect who works with the Foundational Learners Assistance Program, does not have a link on the site. This is because our division and funding is accessed through referrals from people like you and is not recommended to the general public.

We run strictly off of the GOA policies based on Foundational Learners Assistance Funding, aimed towards students aged 16–20 in K–12 education programs, who demonstrate financial need and whether or not they meet the following criteria:

- i) Pregnant or is the parent of a child, or
- Married, have a common-law partner or is widowed, separated, or divorced, or
- iii) There is a breakdown in relationship with the learner's guardian(s) or unsafe living conditions

The student must be registered "Full Time" at an approved educational facility. "Full Time" is defined as being registered and participating in a minimum of 3 classes per semester.

Alberta Works funded learners are expected to attend the program, make acceptable progress, achieve their training goal and facilitate a successful transition to further education or employment. Funding is based on participation/progression in the classes and consultations with the student as well as the school.

In order to Apply for Foundational Learners Assistance students will need to obtain:

- Their Social Insurance Number
- My Alberta Digital ID https://account.alberta.ca/(this is where they can create an account if they do not already have one)
 - After creating an account the government will send verification via text or in the mail (takes 5-10 days)
 - If they do not have the documents required to obtain a MADI, we can work on an Alternate ID Verification process with them
- Banking Information no form anymore but we do need the Transit, Routing, and Account Number

There are 3 different "Branches" to the Application process: the MADI, the email link from Foundational Learners Assistance, and the Assessment completed by our Coordinators.


Once all 3 have been completed/received, we can start the Application.

GIMME THAT SECOND-HAND RELIGION!

"Now I lay me down to sleep. I pray the Lord my soul to keep.

And if I die before I wake, I pray the lord my soul to take."

Probably like you, "Now I Lay Me down to sleep" was the very first prayer I learned in childhood. Every night before bedtime, my mother and I would pray those words together. It was our special prayer – one that was shared between us and no one else. Or so I believed.

Fast forward a few decades to a Sunday morning in Edmonton. I was the guest preacher in a Church not my own. My sermon was on prayer and I had invited everyone to recall the very first prayer they learned as children. My plan was to recite and then offer some thoughts on my own childhood prayer, which I was certain they had never heard before. Imagine my surprise when, after reciting only three words, the entire congregation joined in with me, and we finished MY prayer together...! Ever wonder why expressions of faith, especially our own supposedly unique and personal religious expressions, are often found in unexpected places, and often come from those whose life experiences seem to be so different from our own?

To answer that question, I phoned my mother. She'd learned our prayer, she said, from her mother. Who'd learned it from – her mother. It was one of those truths so plain, simple and ordinary as to be hardly worth remembering – as the most profound truths often are.

Namely, that faith never falls on us directly from heaven like lightning – instantaneously, and powerfully. Instead, real faith happens mostly from us being exposed to the faith of others, and usually after much time has passed. Faith is what we discover as we read between the lines of the stories in our history books - especially in those stories recounting the adventures and life experiences of the people and families in the places we have lived. Faith is what we hope will rub off on us as we gaze, often with curiosity and wonder, at the faces of loved ones in old photographs. Sometimes Faith will only reveal itself to us only if we will have patience to learn, and re-learn, the hard lessons of life

which older generations always hope to pass on to us – sometimes successfully. Sometimes not. Especially, Faith is what we hope will find us as we gather with others engaged in that same quest. Gathering in religious communities allows us to see, hear, and experience the gift of faith that's been given to others like ourselves. In the company of real people, we actually receive the opportunity to have what only second-hand religion can offer – an ever-growing, ever-widening, first-hand experience of God's love and grace.

So...! Who is it in your life, whose "second-hand religion" made YOU the faithful person you are today? Who showed you that faith is the one gift from God that's always given through other people?"
