THE LANGUAGE OF LOVE

LONG AGO, there once lived a man who was an absolute master at speaking the most powerful and amazing language. With just a word, he could calm a raging storm, turn fear into courage, and sadness into the deepest joy. With a single sentence, he could free the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak. With two sentences, lepers were cleansed. Three sentences, and the paralyzed and the infirm began to leap and run. And when he spoke in paragraphs, the earth shook and hearts trembled. Such a man was this man named Jesus, who spoke so powerfully the language of love. Ever wonder, dear ones, what it would be like to speak as Jesus spoke? If speaking the language of love would Definitely bring us closer, why is it that the language Jesus spoke is always the one language we never seem to learn perfectly!?!

And yet, we do try. We make the effort because we know, somehow. that this oft-silent and misunderstood language has many lessons to teach us, and many lessons we need to learn on the journey towards that state of being which all people desire most: To be understood, and to understand; to hear ourselves being spoken to truly, and to speak truly to others - in short, to love, and to be loved, and to faithfully embrace all that love involves, and all that love creates, and all that love demands, and all that love promises. And so we make the effort, and we never give up. We listen. We imitate. We tune in to the words spoken by others, hoping to learn something that might help us to do better. Even just to sound better! We learn to speak words which create joy and hope, words which bespeak patience and offer grace to others. We speak less of those words which tear down and destroy, and slowly allow more of the words which celebrate life to enter our vocabulary. We learn to speak words which honour truth and unity, and shun those words which divide and separate. Slowly, steadily, we learn to speak good words, kind words, and we cease being afraid to speak them often. And we pray! We ask the Spirit of God to continue schooling us in that one language every heart longs to hear, and every soul seeks to imitate - but which is mastered only with continuous effort and unwavering commitment. And most of all, we keep on living. We learn to live for those moments when we who are but the creatures of spirit and dust, catch the voice of the one who is always telling us, always reassuring us saving "I love you! Pass it on!"

Dear ones, as we enter this year's growing season, and as the soil is tilled and the seeds are planted, it's the perfect time to remember that God is also doing his own planting: Continuously, and without ceasing; whispering his Word into the deepest parts of our hearts and souls. Teaching. Reaching. Repeating. Telling us over and over again: I love you.....Pass it on.

And so, in these and in many other ways, we learn to speak the one language, the only language, able to unite hearts to hearts, souls with souls, and heaven with earth.

So! What words of love, or hope, or joy, did you pass on today ..?

What seeds did you sow that might grow into something beautiful, and wonderful, in the soul of another..?




